This is an automatic message by the system to let you know that you have to confirm your account information within 48 hours.

Your account has been frozen temporarily in order to protect it.

This will help protect your in the future the process does not take more than 3 minutes.

How you can be scammed by a method called SIM Splitting

It seems that Organised Crime Groups (OCGs) in the UK purchase victim's personal details that are obtained through the spread of Trojan malware. Victims detail packages are purchased from overseas OCGs specialising in the collection of compromised personal data to sell.

Last week we mentioned that May is Scams Awareness Month and are using this opportunity to launch our **NEW / FREE SCAM STICKER PACK**!

As part of a major project throughout England officers from this service have been visiting residents that have been identified as responding to scam mail. It was obvious that some really did believe that though sending money they would be unlocking and then receiving large cash prizes, holidays and cars. Others felt threatened as bad luck was promised if they didn't reply, and some felt compelled to buy from certain catalogues as they would be entered into (sometimes non-existent) prize draws. We felt that through talking to such victims that reminders not to part with their money, alongside

support and education may help them stop becoming further victims of financial fraud.

The pack contains advice alongside two chequebook stickers and two phone stickers to remind people not to part with their money without thinking twice or getting advice and not to disclose personal details to people over the phone that they don't know.

Summer Infant Video Monitors
