YOUR PARISH RATE

You will shortly be receiving your Council Tax demands and you will see that this year your Parish Council have had to seek an increase in the taxes we spend on your behalf. We have not sought an increase for the last two years and as a result budget overspends have been met through contingency funds. No matter how carefully we budget I am afraid we cannot foresee unusually high costs relating to tree surgery and removal for instance. As a result of the storms only a few weeks ago, bills of over £12,000 are expected and are not covered by insurance except, of course, where a fallen tree damages someone else's property. The effect of our increase on a Band D property will take it from £63.59 pa to £65.19 pa.

On a good note, our spending plans and applications have been successful with the result that very little has impacted on the council tax budget. We are employing Community Service Teams around the village who have cleared our ditches, cut back our overhanging trees and shrubs and worked very hard for Normandy every weekend. We estimate they have saved our community thousands of pounds. We also believe that we have averted possible flood damage in the Guildford Road area. These costs, the hire of the hall for ablutions and tea and coffee were not factored into previous budgets.

We trust that you continue to see that the monies spent by your Parish Council are indeed well spent. This year we have opened the senior children's play area on Normandy Common using Section 106 monies (monies received from developers by Guildford Borough Council) and Parish Council funds. We have also improved the junior play area on Manor Fruit Farm. Our

daffodil planting programme has been extended year on year and new flower beds on Manor Fruit Farm have been put in place. You will also, I hope, have noticed signposts have been installed for our Local Organisations as well as some traffic and village signs. We are seeking advice next year from the Surrey Wildlife Trust on how to better manage Normandy Common and are seeking to return the football pitch to a suitably planted wildlife area when the football club moves to Manor Fruit Farm.

We are employing Sports Solutions GB to raise the funds and commission the necessary works as a result of which Manor Fruit Farm becomes the host, not only to our Football Club, but also to the Mavericks Baseball Club. We are also exploring the possibility of setting up a regular weekly market at Manor Fruit Farm. We have been given permission by the Borough Council but the hard work is yet to be done. Please remember that we meet at the Village Hall on the last Wednesday of every month and we welcome your input. We try to support your concerns. You are very welcome to attend.

All of this has been done on Saturdays and Sundays by Community Service Workers at no cost to the rate payer or Council. When the Workers visit Normandy they need to be looked after by volunteers. Looking after them is quite simple and consists of

meeting their minibus in the Royal British Legion car park sometime between 9 o'clock and 10 o'clock, taking them to the building in which they are to have their breaks, making and serving them tea and coffee and telling the Probation Office Supervisor the tasks to be completed and repeating the tea and coffee when they have their breaks, securing the premises and returning the groceries to the Clerk.

At present all that is being done by the Parish Clerk, Parish Councillors and three other volunteers. Can you afford 3 or 4 hours a month to ease the burden on the present volunteers? The hall bookings, purchase of tea, coffee etc is done for you and the goods delivered to your door.
