C-152 PEDESTRIAN BOLLARDS

In 1.2 of the strategic action plan the council committed to promote safer pedestrian and cycle routes. One element of this commitment, as agreed by colleagues forming the previous council, is the installation of bollards to determine a safer pedestrian walkway on Westwood Lane, outside St Marks Church, whilst allowing cars (Church and school parent parking) to continue to park on road.

On 15 March Surrey County Council's Stakeholder Engagement Officer for Guildford attended the location with a SCC Traffic Engineer, and a scheme has now been put forward by Highways to install bollards for the full length of the footway the cost of which will be approximately £10,000.

The scheme is:

- 40 solid polyurethane bollards spaced at 2.5m centres and 450mm from the edge of the carriageway to maintain maximum footway width and to differentiate a pedestrian area
- 6 mini ensign bollards with pedestrian and cycle stickers at the end of the sections, these mini bollards will be placed in the centre of the footway to prevent vehicular access.

It has been highlighted to SCC the importance of marking out a hearse bay and some disabled bays.

Matters for consideration:

Cllr Keith Witham (SCC) has written to the council to enquire:

- i. Does Normandy Parish Council want this be a collaboration between SCC and NPC? And in which case, would the parish council consider contributing financially to the cost?
- ii. If so, how much contribution be offered?
